

Public Education in Tokyo

Educational Objectives (excerpt)

The Tokyo Metropolitan Board of Education places importance on an education that nurtures:

- · Thoughtful people who adapt to the norms of society and show respect for others' individuality
- · People who contribute to society as members of society
- · People abounding in individuality and creativity who voluntarily engage in learning and thinking activities in the hope of fostering knowledge, sensitivity, morals and physical strength and developing children rich in humanity.

Scale

- · Number of metropolitan senior high schools: 188
- · Number of metropolitan senior high school students: Approx. 140,000

Curriculum

- · Required courses, etc. are determined by the General Policies Regarding Curriculum Formulation set out by the country.
- · Volunteer and Japanese History courses, which are both unique to Tokyo, are required.
- · In addition to the general course, the Agriculture Department, Industrial Department, Commerce Department, and Comprehensive Department have been established.
